The largest of Egypt's many ancient pyramids, is situated 16 kilometres east of Cairo in the Giza plain. The base of the pyramid is 70 square metres in area and is levelled to a fraction of a centimetre. The sides are aligned to the four cardinal points, north, south, east and west; that is each side faces one of these points. The sides slope at an angle of 51 degrees 51 minutes from the base and the present height of the pyramid is over 137 metres.

However, the apex is missing, and there is no historical record of one having ever existed.

There is no surviving record as to when, how or by whom the Great Pyramid was constructed. It has usually been accepted that it was built sometime in the third millennium B.C., but many modern scholars maintain that at that time the engineering skill of the Egyptians was inadequate for such a gigantic undertaking. Moreover, the design of the pyramid incorporates certain mathematical formulae that were unknown at that time. Some people believe that the pyramid was built much earlier by, or with the assistance of, survivors of a lost civilization that was intellectually, technologically and, probably morally superior to the society that has existed since. But this theory involves much speculation and little concrete evidence.

Apart from the mystery of its origins, the Great Pyramid also possesses mysterious properties. Modern visitors have noticed the mummified remains of small animals which had evidently wandered into it; despite the strangely humid atmosphere of the king' chamber, the bodies had not decayed but had been preserved through dehydration. This observation gave rise to the idea that the pyramid shape itself has played a part in the marvellous preservation of the mummified bodies of the pharaohs discovered in some of the pyramids. Recently much research has been done on the physical properties of the pyramid shape, and a great many experiments have been carried out with pyramids of various sizes and materials, ranging from paper models a few centimetres high to outdoor constructions of wood or plastic, large enough for a person to sleep in. The most amazing results have been recorded; food is preserved, milk turns to yoghurt, plants grow more quickly, blunt razors are sharpened, toothache is cured, and those who meditate enter exalted states of consciousness. It seems that a special energy field is created by the pyramid shape and this energy accumulates towards the apex.

This advantage enables it to convey various emotions effectively and to create appropriate moods in the listeners. Tala is the rhythm of a song. Harmonious union of Raga and Tala, make the Indian classical music a divine experience. No wonder it has won the hearts of the western people. The Indian classical music is as popular in the west as it is in India. Some music lovers are making efforts to bridge the gap between the Indian and Western music.

In India dance is not regarded as a mode of entertainment. It is a method of spiritual realization through aesthetic expression. Shiva, one of the major Gods of a Trinity, is the symbol of dance and he is often referred to and depicted as Nataraja.

The Indian classical dances come in a variety of forms. The Bharata Natyam of Tamil Nadu, the Kathak of the North, the Manipuri of the East and the Kathakali of Kerala are famous among them. Odissi of Orissa, Kuchipudi of Andhra and Mohini Attam of Kerala are also well-known dance forms. The Yakshagana of Karnataka is a form of folk or dance-drama.

All these dances are capable of conveying profound emotions through facial expressions and gestures. They can express emotions like anger, sorrow, love, hope, depression, etc. very well. The success of these dances lies in coordinated movements of hands, legs and the body. Eyes and facial muscles also play a vital role in expressing emotions. A successful dancer has to undergo strenuous practice for a long time.







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
